County recovers \$128K after scam

Madison County has recovered over \$120,000 in millions they were scammed out of recently in road construction payments.

Sheriff Randy Tucker told the Board of Supervisors this week that another almost \$2.1 million has been located and is in the process of being recovered.

"We are currently in the process of waiting on federal authorities to discover and issue subpoenas to additional financial institutions across the country," Tucker said on Monday.

Tucker said about \$128,000 has been recovered from one institution and they are currently working on recovering \$1.58 million and about \$500,000 from other institutions.

"At this point, we're looking at the possible recovery of \$2.2 million at this point and hopes of recovering the balance," he said. The Sheriff added that the

The Sheriff added that the investigation was ongoing but it has so far yielded no

criminal intent on behalf of any Madison County employees.

Supervisors announced last week that the county comptroller fell victim to a sophisticated social engineering scam that resulted in over \$2.7 million of State Aid bond monies allocated for Reunion Parkway to be sent to a fraudster. The board was first alerted to the scheme on March 19, when it was discovered that \$2,741,243.69 was paid to someone claiming to be the president of Hemphill Construction.

Comptroller Na'Son White sent electronic ACH payments to someone claiming to be Jay Hemphill, the CEO of Hemphill Construction Co., the contractor currently working on the Reunion Parkway project, according to the Sheriff's Office incident report.

White sent three payments beginning on Feb. 20, 2024, for \$128,989.97. A second payment of \$1,073,870.66 was made on March 5, and a

Warnock trial set for June

The federal trial of former Madison County Engineer Rudy Warnock scheduled to begin on Monday has once again been continued, marking the eighth such delay in the case.

Warnock, who was indicted in November 2022 on federal bribery and wire charges, is now scheduled to stand trial on June 3, U.S. District Judge Henry T. Wingate ruled on Friday.

Former Canton Municipal Utilities Chairman Cleveland Anderson, also facing felony bribery charges, is also scheduled to stand trial on June 3 after he also sought a continuance in

In February, a Washington D.C. prosecutor was appointed as counsel for the U.S., court records show.

Kathryn E. Fifield with the Public Integrity Section of the U.S. Department of Justice was appointed to the case.

FRAZIER CASE Supremes uphold charges

The Mississippi Supreme Court last week affirmed the charges against one of the accomplices in the 2017 slaying of six-year-old Kingston Frazier in Gluckstadt.

The defense for Dwan Wakefield argued he faces double jeopardy for being charged with three separate accessories after the fact related to Byron McBride's murder of six-yearold Kingston Frazier.

The state Supreme Court ruled on Thursday, March 28, he did not face double jeopardy in the case.

"We hold today that, under the unit of prosecution test, the State may charge multiple vio-

Canton aldermen Eric Gilkey and Andrew Grant were unsealed in November 2022.

Warnock was indicted on two counts of conspiracy to commit bribery, one count of conspiracy to commit wire

fraud, and one count of wire fraud.

Warnock pleaded not guilty at his initial appearance. He faces up to 30 years in prison if convicted.

Gilkey and Grant have both pleaded guilty and are awaiting sentencing, presumably following the conclusion of the criminal trials of Warnock and Anderson.


Anderson initially pleaded

According to the indictments, Warnock is alleged to have gifted cash, football tickets, and concert tickets to the three in exchange for engineering contracts with the city of Canton and CMU.

RIDGELAND — The Planet Fitness on Lake Harbour Drive was one of four gyms in the metro cleared following bomb threats last week

final payment of \$1,538,383.06 was made on March 12

According to the incident report, the county purchasing clerk received an initial email which was later forwarded to County Administrator Greg Higginbotham before being forwarded to White.

The email requested a change in the bank account for payment.

The payments were initially cent to a Citizens Bank N.A. account.

On March 11, one of the payments was returned, and White called the fraudster and was given a Bank of America bank account.

"All invoices that the county received from Hemphill Construction Company were true, legitimate invoices sent from the actual company building the parkway phases," the incident report says. "The only difference she could find in the emails that the invoices came from was a '.com' email address was used, whereas a '.us' was used for the ACH payment form.'

Tucker said on Monday that criminals are "getting smarter and smarter," and the social engineering scheme likely occurred by the fraudsters sifting through public records such as claims dockets and contract awards that are all available on the county's website.

Madison County Chancery Clerk Ronny Lott and Higginbotham outlined a couple of short-term and long-term checks and balances they would like to implement to ensure something like this doesn't happen again in the future.

For the short term, Higginbotham said they have placed a moratorium on all ACH payments and vendors will be paid with paper checks. In addition, the ACH bank form has been taken off the county's website and any vendor electing to change a bank account will have to contact the county in the

future to receive a copy.

As far as long-term solutions, Higginbotham and Lott suggested the county hire an internal auditor that falls under the Chancery Clerk's Office to ensure processes across county departments are sufficient and processes are followed.

This is another way to get an extra set of eyes on the county's financial transactions," Higginbotham said.

The county administrator said the state requires this for state agencies and the county's budget alone is larger than a "significant number of state agencies.'

Another long-term solution proposed will be the addition of tech-based solutions such as ongoing cybersecurity training for employees regarding everything from safeguarding phishing attempts to social engineering.

Board President Gerald Steen asked that the longterm solutions be brought back before the board to discuss viability and implementation.

The Post Office problem

The Postal Service has always been a money-loser — but it doesn't have to be. Louis DeJoy had the right idea when he was appointed to head this 250-year-old institution in 2020.

His Delivering for America plan aspired to make USPS financially viable within few years. This was a reasonable, but also controversial strategy, tainted by unfounded charges that Mr. DeJoy was using his office to provide political assistance to the GOP.

That innovative road map now languishes in the dead letter office as the organization continues to lose cash at the rate of \$6 billion per year. The Postal Service has invested billions redesigning the postal network only to see service decline and complaints rise.

USPS can't use the economy as an excuse for the failure — especially with the 29% increase in postal rates over the past three years. Every business is struggling under Bidenflation, but most still manage to turn a profit.

Congress offered a lifeline in the form of the Postal Service Reform Act in 2022, relieving the organization of some unique, even unfair employee healthcare obligations many said were responsible for the magnitude of the Postal Service's operating loss.

Mr. DeJoy intended to slash costs by \$34 billion over ten years, but they continue skyward thanks to labor costs that comprise 75% of annual expenses. It takes an iron will to fix a problem at this scale, but it can be done.

When unionized full-time employees retire, that's the ideal time to skip filling those positions so the workforce is trimmed to match the steady decline in mail delivery volume, which dropped another 9% last year. This was done successfully about a decade ago, but Mr. DeJoy chose a different path. He filled the vacancies by converting 125,000 part-time employees into full-time workers. He then went out and hired more part-timers.

That's a double whammy that, rather than allowing the total number of postal service slots to fade away peacefully, added 30,000 careerists to the employment rolls over three years.

Mr. DeJoy argued converting parttimers to career status reduced overtime costs. He even bragged about how USPS was fully staffed for the last Christmas shipping rush. That's a lousy deal, because permanent, unionized career employees are paid 50% more per hour and enjoy deluxe retirement benefits. Fully staffing for the busiest time means having excess employees for the remainder of the year.

The private sector deals with such needs by maintaining a flexible workforce that can be scaled down as demand declines. The proper response to a downturn in demand is not to scale up.

The worst anti-reform was the decision to terminate contracts with outside firms engaged in long-haul delivery. The private sector was handling the job efficiently and cost-effectively. Rather than allow that to continue, USPS is bringing that function back in-house.

Congress ordered the Postal Service to continue to maintain an integrated network that provides affordable, reliable service throughout the country. That's a tall order, especially if, as Mr. DeJoy now acknowledges, it may run out of money by 2028. Rather than reduce the role private contractors play, the USPS must look for ways to expand it. **CAL THOMAS**

One more try at reducing the debt

It may be too late given the number of Americans who have willingly allowed themselves to become dependent on government more than themselves, but it's worth trying.

Our \$34 trillion debt is unsustainable, according to most economists. If we don't act soon, we will be worse off than we are now. Our economy could collapse. The economic future is not bright if we continue down our current path. According to Statista Research," By 2034, the gross federal debt of the United States is projected to be about \$54,39 trillion."

President Biden wants to raise taxes again on "the rich" and corporations without cutting spending. Revenue is not in short supply. Fiscal discipline is. A change in spending will require a change in attitude about what government should and should not do.

The U.S. has experienced a fiscal year-end budget surplus five times in the last 50 years, most recently in 2001. Debt is bipartisan and it will take a bipartisan approach to reduce or eliminate it. During President Biden's term, national debt has increased by\$4.7 trillion (he wants to spend more), a rise of 16.67 percent as of last September. During Donald Trump's one- term presidency, the national debt increased by \$8.18 trillion, a 40.43 percent boost. Part of that was spending to fight Covid-19, part was the fallout from tax cuts for the wealthy. Still, this was less of an increase than Barack Obama Our \$34 trillion debt is unsustainable, according to most economists. If we don't act soon, we will be worse off than we are now. (69.98%) and George W. Bush (105.8%), but each of them served two terms. Part of Bush's spending was on Afghanistan and Iraq after 9/ 11.

Only 14 of 45 American presidents have overseen a decrease in debt. Calvin Coolidge was the last one. That was 15 presidents ago. Coolidge said: "... a good many proposals are made by people that have very excellent things that they would like to have the Government do, but they come from people that have no responsibility for providing ways and means by which their proposals can be carried out. I don't think in all my experience, which has been very large with people that come before me in and out of Government with proposals for spending money, I have ever had any proposal from anyone as to what could be done to save any money."

Why not form a group of consultants I would call a "what works coalition." Invite historians, scientists, economists, people of good character and others who love America and ask them to examine government spending, separating the "wheat from the chaff," the necessary from the unnecessary. They could issue a report

to the public and Congress ridiculing wasteful and needless spending and pressure our elected representatives to end those underperforming or nonperforming programs, earmarks and agencies as a patriotic gesture. And yes, Social Security and Medicare must be reformed to save it for the future. The media could help if they would. Weaning people from addiction to government will take time, though some have been able to go "cold turkey" when it comes to other addictions.

Most importantly, what is needed is a change in attitude back to the view some previous presidents, the Founders and the public had toward government. Just as we don't see a doctor when we are having car trouble, neither should we look to government to solve problems best dealt with individually. Government can encourage good choices and penalize bad ones (lower taxes on the successful is one reward and allowing people to suffer the consequences of bad choices – within reason -- is another). Government should not subsidize bad choices, as if good and bad are equal. That will ensure more bad choices and fewer good ones.

If we don't start making good choices now and seriously reduce our debt there may be no way back. History teaches us that lesson. Look it up.

Colorblindness is our best idea

Writer Coleman Hughes went on "The View" and was greeted almost as though he had shown up wearing a white hood. Hughes, a soft-spoken black intellectual who is a political independent, was talking about his new book, "The End of Race Politics: Arguments for a Colorblind America." Once upon a time colorblindness was an uncontroversial idea. It was considered a core American ideal and worth aspiring to, even if we were failing to live up to it. In recent decades, though, it has run into a buzz-saw of opposition. It clashes with the Left's neartheological commitment to racial preferences, especially on college campuses, and with fashionable new forms of leftwing racialism.

The Ukraine conundrum

House Speaker Mike Johnson is in a tight spot. With a single-vote majority, no matter what choice he makes about bankrolling Ukraine's fight with Russia, he's likely to spark an internal rebellion when Congress returns from vacation next week.

The Louisiana Republican floated a few ideas in an Easter Sunday interview with Fox News host Trey Gowdy. As Mr. Johnson explained, the best he can do under the circumstances is offer incremental progress.

"You gotta build consensus," the speaker said. "If we want to move a partisan measure, I gotta have every single member — literally."

Mr. Johnson isn't falling for President Biden's disingenuous \$61 billion proposal wrapping Ukraine aid into a package that also provides some support for Israel, Taiwan, and our southern border. "They opened the border intentionally," Mr. Johnson said.

Instead, he wants the so-called national security bill to have "important innovations" such as the REPO Act, which would effectively steal the property of Russian citizens and send it to Ukraine. "If we can use the seized assets of Russian oligarchs to allow the Ukrainians to fight them, that's just pure poetry," he said.

Of course, when countries such as Cuba and Venezuela seized U.S. property, the United States rightly retaliated. It's hard to see how such a move wouldn't be shortsighted, discouraging foreigners from ever trusting the United States with their assets.

Another option on the table is sending the cash to Ukrainian leader Volodymyr Zelenskyy and calling the handout a loan. "They can provide it back to us when the time is right," said Mr. Johnson. We know how that will go.

Without any auditing of the funds

already dispensed, there's no way to know how many millions are already stashed in offshore accounts belonging to officials in a country that, before Russia invaded it, ranked near the bottom — not far from Russia — in Transparency International's corruption index.

Perhaps the most promising idea the speaker is floating would leverage the Ukraine issue to cajole President Biden into repealing his ban on the export of our natural gas resources.

The left is reluctant to oblige because driving up the cost of fossil fuels is the key to making inefficient windmills and solar panels seem attractive. The administration's energy policy only plays into the hands of Russia — the world's No. 2 natural gas producer behind the United States. Reducing energy costs, on the other hand, is great for Americans and puts the squeeze on the primary source of capital for Vladimir Putin's war machine.

Opponents of financing a conflict that has taken 70,000 Ukrainian lives would probably want to see a blueprint for how further assistance wouldn't simply perpetuate the bloodshed for the benefit of defense contractors.

To hold together a party holding such divergent views, Mr. Johnson shouldn't tie the vote to Israel or rebuilding Baltimore's Francis Scott Key Bridge. Put Democrats in the hot seat by forcing them to choose between supporting Ukraine and reducing Mr. Putin's energy profits or enhancing U.S. border security. After all, we shouldn't invest in someone else's border to the neglect of our own.

Stuck in a no-win situation, the speaker might find consensus if he can craft legislative language that moves the needle on illegal immigration and energy. Even the fiercest opponents of aid to Ukraine might take that deal.

So it is naive, out-of-date and, worse, even a tool of oppression used by sneaky racists to hide their malignant designs in lofty rhetoric.

This was the attitude of cohost Sunny Hostin when Hughes showed up on set. She declared that colorblindness has been "co-opted" by conservatives, and that the widely respected Hughes is a "charlatan." For the offense, mind you, of arguing that people should be treated equally regardless of their race.

Thoughtless even by the standards of a panelist of "The View," Hostin was easily outmatched by Hughes, who pushed back without getting flustered or raising his voice. He even won occasional applause from the studio audience for ideas that still, despite all that has been done to belittle them, have strong common-sense appeal in America.

As Coleman notes in his book, a devotion to color-

blindness runs through some of the most honored writers and activists in American history, the likes of Frederick Douglass, Wendell Phillips, Zora Neale Hurston, A. Philip Randolph, Bayard Rustin and, of course, Martin Luther King Jr.

The Left always wants to retroactively enlist MLK for woke racial causes and thinking, but Hughes convincingly locates the great civil-rights leader firmly within the colorblind tradition.

In a statement that might now earn him an unfriendly reception on college campuses (or on the set of "The View"), King maintained, "Black supremacy is as dangerous as white supremacy, and God is not interested merely in the freedom of black men and brown men and yellow men. God is interested in the freedom of the whole human race."

Such a majestic, deeply felt belief in what unites us as persons and Americans can only scandalize today's so called "anti-racists," whom Hughes deems, more accurately, "neoracists." They have much in common with the white supremacists that they array themselves against. "They both deny our common humanity," Hughes writes. "They both deny that all races are created equal. They both agree that some races are superior to others, and they

in society."

The neo-racist project is nonetheless ascendant in America's elite institutions, and a narrative of racial conflict has gained more traction in recent years. Hughes attributes the sense of worsening race relations since 2013 to the rise of social media and the accelerated spread of racially charged false stories and myths. We've talked, and clicked, our way into believing we are in a state of racial crisis.

The neo-racists fan the dissension by attributing any racial disparity in America to racism, and ignoring the influence of demographics, geography and especially culture. They disregard, or disparage, all the indicators of racial progress, which are inconvenient to their simplistic condemnations of American society as fundamentally and irredeemably racist.

For Hughes, the alternatives are "a grim world in which whites and non-white eternally swap the roles of the oppressor and the oppressed," or a world where we "recommit ourselves to the principles that motivated the civil rights movement."

This wouldn't seem a difficult choice. Yet, the very notion of colorblindness is now anathema to much of progressive America. Sunny Hostin is sadly representative in her reflexive hostility to the belief that we should — and can — treat one another without regard to race. So much the worse for her.

BIBLICAL PERSPECTIVES/J. Ligon Duncan III

Revive us again

If you have your Bibles, I'd invite you to turn with me to Psalm 85. This Psalm seeks to answer the question: What does a Christian do when he or she feels the judgment of God visit? What do we do in the circumstances of our life when we've known the forgiveness of God, we've known the blessing of God, and then we've come into a valley and we're confused in that valley? How do we respond? This Psalm is telling us what to do and it marks three stages of response.

First, I want you to notice in verses 1-3, they remember. Secondly, in verses 4-7, they resort. And then, finally, in verses 8-13, they resolve.

Í. Remember

In verses 1 - 3, notice how the psalmist states that he is remembering the greatness of God's saving favor and forgiveness to them in bringing them out of the exile: "O Lord, You showed favor to Your land; You restored the captivity of Jacob." He's looking back and he is remembering what the Lord had done in bringing them out of captivity, and he is actively, deliberately, remembering the favor that God has shown upon him.

Now, remembering is a very important thing, and I want to say that remembering here is not just like, "Oh, I remember that phone call that I need to make." No, this is remembering of a higher order. This is remembrance that anchors the believer in the reality of what God has done, and in this case, there is a remembrance of how God restored the children of Israel from exile.

And you see the gladness in the heart of this Old Testament believer as he remembers what God has done, because sin is serious, and that exile was deserved; and yet, God in His mercy has taken that sin away, has forgiven them, has restored them to the land. The believer, the Christian, looks back in the same way to the finished work of Jesus Christ and rejoices that God has done this. And it means that we live in a deep, real gratitude for an undeserved rescue. It also means that we are always going to take our sin and God's salvation seriously. The believer looks back upon the work of Jesus Christ and he takes his sin seriously because he sees the Son of God on the cross, and he says, "He had to die

for my sins to be forgiven? How great my sins must be! How great must the Father's love be! How great must the Son's love be!" The believer never stops rejoicing in the greatness of that redemption from sin. He never gets tired of hearing the gospel. It's the starting point of everything. And you see, this Psalm is pointing us to that. And so the psalmist says take sin seri-ously, and rejoices in redemption. It starts with remembering this redemption, this great saving for-giveness of God.

II. Resort

And then, secondly, notice in verses 4 - 7 how the psalmist resorts to God. Where does he go? He's part of the people who have been brought out of the exile, but now he feels the punishment of God because of the unfaithfulness of God's people. God's wrath is being visited. What does he do? He resorts to God as the only hope of salvation. He takes refuge in God's character and actions. In this passage, we see what God is going to do to remedy these circumstances. Notice verse 4: "Restore us..." then verse 6: "Revive us..." then verse 7: "Show us Your lovingkindness." In other words, the psalmist is pointing us to God and God alone, because of His character and His promises. He is saying, "Take refuge in God in this time of indignation and punishment. Run to God for your refuge. Resort to God as the only hope of salvation. Look to God alone because of who He is.'

One of the commentators on this passage reminds us that this Psalm makes it clear that what God delights in is this glorious creative work where He brings blessing out of cursing, where He showers forgiveness where it's not deserved, where He brings restoration where there's been fracture. That's what God delights in. That's the center of His heart. And God, from His heart, has made promises to His people. You see how the language itself goes back to Abraham? "Will You prolong Your anger to all gen-erations?" It goes back to Abraham, back to Moses. Remember how God is spoken of in the days of Abra-ham and Moses? "You are the Lord. You will not visit Your wrath and indignation forever, but You will shower Your grace and favor on our children to a thousand generations."

That's God. That's who He is. That's the promise He's made, and the psalmist resorts to this God as the only hope of salvation. Notice that the psalmist doesn't resort to his own goodness. He doesn't resort to his own promise, "I'll do better." He doesn't resort to some technique...if you only do this...if you take your faith up to a higher notch. No, everything's on God. He resorts to God. And so he remembers the greatness of God's forgiveness, and he resorts to God as the only hope of salvation. He looks to God alone. **III. Resolve**

Don't you love what he says in verses 8-13? "I will hear what God the Lord will say; For He will speak peace to His people." Bumper sticker theology almost always gets it wrong, but there is one bumper sticker that I've seen that absolutely gets it right- it says "No Jesus? No peace." In other words, if you don't know Jesus, you can't have the peace of God. And then right under it, what does it say? "Know Jesus? Know Peace." In other words, if you know Jesus, you know the peace of God. And that bumper sticker gets it exactly right. In fact, it could be a commentary on this passage! And the psalmist is saying, "I'm standing to wait because I have as a sinner cast myself on the mercy of God. and I know that He will speak His benediction on His people." Because when you know Jesus, you know peace.

Samuel Rutherford, the great Scottish minister and theologian, went through times where he felt the wrath and indignation of God so much that it almost undid him. And he said of that one time, "I hang by a thread, but it is of Christ's spinning." In other words, that thread that I'm hanging by was spun by Christ. And that's all he needs. And this psalmist says, "Lord, we're under Your condemnation. We're under Your just condemnation, but I've resorted to You and now I'm just going to wait until Your blessing comes, because that's the kind of God you are: a God that delights to forgive people that don't deserve it."

UMMC urges caution for solar eclipse

As the Solar Eclipse of 2024 looms, be warned that the face of the sun may not be the only thing that will fade.

Other potential disappearing acts include bird songs, cumulus clouds and your eyesight.

"If you choose to view the eclipse, please follow recommended precautions and take the information seriously,' said Dr. Kimberly Crowder, professor and Drs. Ching-Jygh and Lin Chen Chair for Excellence in Ophthalmology at the University of Mississippi Medical Center.

"Even brief amounts of exposure to ultraviolet radiation can cause permanent damage to the eyes, even blindness. Unfortunately, we saw patients with damage after the last eclipse a few years ago and, while we are



In Christ, you are rich indeed

Revelation 2:8-11 is the letter to the church in Smyrna from the Lord Jesus. He tells the church he knows what they are going through: "I know your tribulation and your poverty (but you are rich) and the slander of those who say that they are Jews and are not, but are a synagogue of

Economic prosperity came from Rome, and Smyrna was known for honoring the Emperor of Rome. Rome allowed regions under its reign to worship their own gods so long as they didn't rebel against Rome. Judaism was an acceptable religion to Rome. For a time, Christians were seen as connected to Judaism, but in Smyrna it is apparent the Jews had accused Christians of being opposed to Rome.

This happened in other cities as well (see Acts 17 and events in Thessalonica). The effect of this slander in Smyrna was to cause Christians to suffer economic hardship. They might have lost their job or business, been fined, or endured other hardships. They suffered for belonging to

The Lord tells the church that though they are poor in this world, they are rich spiritually. The apostle Paul said of his own poverty, "As having nothing yet possessing all things." If we have Christ as our portion, we can never be impoverished in what matters the most. Our chief good will be in the infinite God.

Earthly goods or portions are perishing and left behind when we die. At Christ's right hand are eternal riches. Patrick Henry, the famous patriot in the founding of America, ends his will with a statement about his worldly goods: "This is the poor inheritance I leave to my dear family. But the religion of Christ can give you an inheritance that will make you rich

In verse 10, we see that the Lord tells his people in Smyrna that they are going to go through more suffering: "Do not fear what you are about to suffer. Behold, the devil is about to throw some of you into prison, that you may be tested, and for ten days you will have tribulation. Be faithful unto death and I will give you the crown

When you hear, "Do not fear," and then an alert that prison and death may be around the next bend, it isn't easy to not be nervous. The encouragement "Do not fear" is connected to the sovereignty of Christ over the tribulation. He says it is a test, which means it will show the validity of their faith and assure them that they will receive the crown of life, meaning eternal life.

Throughout the New Testament, Christians are taught to value eternity over the present world. Paul described the great afflictions he suffered as "light and momentary in comparison to the eternal weight of glory.'

James said to Christians facing tribulation, "Blessed is the man who remains steadfast under trial, for when he has stood the test he will receive the crown of life." Peter says something similar in his first epistle when he tells Christians that their trials are proving the genuineness of their faith which is of more worth than gold which perishes.

George Swinnock, a 17th century Christian, knew what it was to face suffering and death for his faith. He writes to other Christians who are facing tribulation, "Make Christ your chief portion. You may receive comfort from this portion in the most afflicted condition. Do men steal your possessions? You have a more enduring substance and are rich toward Christ.

'Do they cast you into prison? Though your body is in chains, you may fly to heaven in meditation and prayer. Do they take away your food? You have food to eat they know not of. Is your body sick? Your soul is sound, so all is well. If your enemies kill you, they cannot hurt you. They do you a kindness by freeing you from your corruptions and sending you to heaven. Blessed are they who die in the Lord. God is our portion - O think of it and take comfort in it.
